PHILIP MUSGROVE is a Deputy Editor of *Health Affairs*, the journal of health policy published by Project HOPE. From October 2002 to October 2005 he was one of the Editors of the Disease Control Priorities Project at the Fogarty International Center of the National Institutes of Health. He was until retirement in 2002 a Principal Economist at The World Bank, having been Advisor in Health Economics, Pan American Health Organization (1982-1990). He served from 1996 to 1998 the Bank's Resident Mission in Brasilia, Brazil, and in 1999-2001 was seconded by the Bank to the World Health Organization in Geneva. He is Adjunct Professor in the School of Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University, and has previously taught at George Washington University, American University and the University of Florida.

Musgrove has worked on health reform projects in Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Colombia, besides dealing with a variety of issues in health economics, financing, equity, and nutrition. His publications include *Consumer Behavior in Latin America* (Brookings Institution, 1978), *Fighting Malnutrition: Evaluation of Brazilian Food and Nutrition Programs* (World Bank, 1989), *Investing in Health: World Development Report 1993* (with several colleagues; World Bank, 1993), *Public and Private Roles in Health: Theory and Financing Patterns* (World Bank, 1996), *World Health Report 2000 – Health Systems: Improving Performance* (as editor and with several colleagues, World Health Organization, 2000), *Health Economics in Development* (World Bank, 2004), *Disease Control Priorities in Developing Countries* (as editor and co-author of five chapters, Oxford University Press for the World Bank, 2006) and more than 50 articles in economics and health journals and chapters in 20 books. He is fluent in English, Spanish and Portuguese, and has a more limited command of French.
